Fellowship

The fellowship

The Marion Dönhoff Foundation funding fellowships at the Michael Succow Foundation creates a unique chance for post-graduate research on environmental issues focussing on the region of post-soviet states. With this fellowship two renowned foundations make a joint effort for an environmentally aware, responsible and proactive youth.

The fellowship's goals:

- promoting the critical analysis and debate on issues concerning environment, sustainability and political ecology
- simultaneously supporting a critical East-West dialogue
- fostering environmental journalism and media debate on these issues
- supporting regional and international networks

Who may apply?

The programme is geared towards post-graduates with professional experience and activists from civil society networks and environmental groups focusing on regions in post-soviet states, including the South Caucasus and Central Asia. Applicants should be between 25 and 38 years old. Good language skills in English or German (written and spoken) are required. In exceptional cases and given outstanding qualifications, applications in Russian language can be accepted.

What's funded?

The fellowship funds a study and work visit in Germany for up to five months. Up to four persons a year are eligible to receive the grant.

What are fellows to do?

Fellows work on a subject of their own choice relevant to the programme's goals and do publish their results. Fellows can stay with up to two further organisations next to the Michael Succow Foundation.

When to apply?

Applications may be handed in by email each year before 1st of July and 1st of January.

How to apply?

Applicants shall submit:

- a one-page letter of motivation
- a project description (up to three pages) of issue to be analysed, including preferred host organisations
- CV
- copy/scan of passport



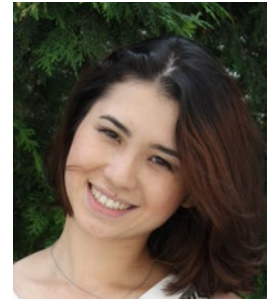
